Availability of Funds

- Approximately \$2,000,000 available to develop and document processes and best practices for coordinating quality and cost-effective:
 - A. Voting system pre-election logic and accuracy testing
 - B. Post-election audits.

Logic and Accuracy Testing

Pre-election testing, also called Logic and Accuracy testing (L&A testing), is the act of testing every ballot style and every component of the voting system prior to the election.

Post-Election Audit

The post-election audit is a documented review of all aspects of the conduct of an election from beginning to end.

Types of Applications

	Logic & Accuracy Testing	Post-Election Audits
12 month	Documenting high-quality, practices currently in place	Documenting high quality, effective policies, practices and procedures currently in use
24 month	Piloting new or alternative methods that are not yet in use	Piloting new or alternative methods that are not currently being used, or used in a limited fashion

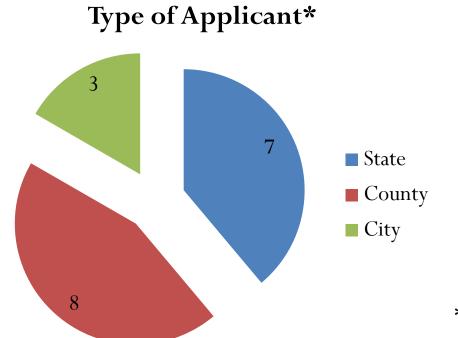
Maximum Award Amounts

- State Governments: \$230,000
- Local Government Entities:
 - Voting population 1 million and over: \$125,000 *
 - Voting population 500,001 and over: \$50,000 *

 - Voting population up to 250,000: \$25,000 *

Approval by Executive Director

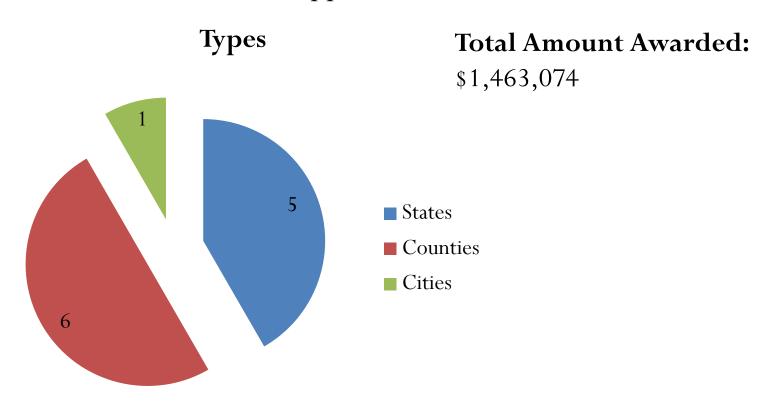
- Recommendations from Staff Review are reviewed and approved

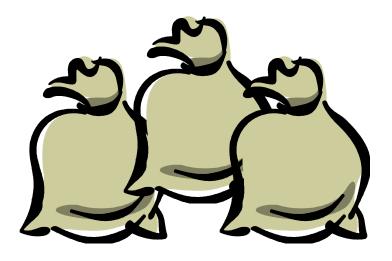


Appropriations FY2009 & FY2010
