

Your polling place is in an area with an expected high turnout. Please be advised that your wait time could be 30 minutes or higher during peak voting times, which are from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m., and 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Please Note: Poll site wait times are approximate and are not an actual representation. Calculated estimates are based on historical turnout in your precinct. Many factors can effect voter turnout and you are encouraged to vote during off-peak hours (9:00 a.m. to 4 p.m.). Heavy turnout can increase these estimated wait times. If you are concerned about waiting in line to vote you are encouraged to exercise one of the other options available to voters, such as vote-by mail (deadline to request a vote-by-mail ballot is June 18, 2013).

Map of voter address and polling place, with route information


Directions

Make Sure You're Designated as a Military Voter

When you are designated as a military voter your ballot is available 30 days prior to regular ballots, giving you more time to return your ballot. You can also receive your ballot via email.

Change your designation to military voter or verify status >



Receive Your Ballot Electronically

If you're already designated as a military voter you can access your ballot electronically. We provide this service for armed forces personnel in the event that you did not receive your ballot.

Access your ballot if you did not receive your regular ballot >



Email Security

In an effort to protect your privacy you can secure your email and keep it off of the voter files. This will prevent third party individuals from accessing your email, which will eliminate unsolicited emails from being sent to you. Secure my email >
