

Background

- UOCAVA population is growing
- Eligible voters face persistent hurdles
- Many who try to register and vote are disenfranchised
- State-based system remains varied, and therefore, complex

The same challenges felt by both LEOs and UOCAVA voters



UOCAVA Disenfranchisement Levels Federal Elections, 2004

19% of voters received their ballots after November 2nd or not at all

+

24% of voters received their ballots late— in the last two weeks of October

=

43% total voters received late ballots or no ballot at all





- Can be licensed at for branded use on other websites









Practical Approach

- Solves identified, yet persistent problems of UOCAVA voter registration
 - Availability: now everywhere over the Internet
 - Simplicity: online and user-friendly
 - Accuracy: error-checking, customized by state; features automatic address provision
 - Legibility: printed forms support improved documents for submission and record retention



Real Value in Real Time Reporting

- Site traffic can be misleading (2 million+ hits to date)
- What counts is
 - Actual usage/acceptance of the services
 - Growth rate of use of individual services
 - % completion rate of registration program
- Descriptive data gathering
 - States in which voters are registering
 - Countries in which they live
 - Types of voters using the site


Surveys and Research

- Commitment to post election surveys, analysis of voter trends, in-depth understanding of real voter issues, and recommendations
- 2004 Post Election Survey: Published online: June 2005
 - Sent to 64,000 overseas voters
 - 17% response rate
 - 11,000 respondents
- 2006 Post Election Survey:
 - Collaborative project with the UC Berkeley Election Administration Research Center

The US Midterm Election is nearing: September 1st you'll only have about 38 days left for your completed overseas voter registration form to arrive in your jurisdiction, as most states require your overseas voter registration form 30 days in advance of Election Day. If you haven't done it yet, register and request your absentee ballot now!

Let's not let a simple question stand between you and voting this year. Here are the Top 10 Frequently Asked Questions that we receive from voters like you.

1. What is the registration deadline in my state?

Check OVF's state-by-state listing of 2006 VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINES. The list gives the day by which your completed form must arrive. * Click here

2. How do I register to vote from overseas?

Go to RAVA - Registration and Absentee Voter Application - provided online by the nonpartisan, nonprofit Overseas Vote Foundation.

3. How long can I wait to register from overseas?

Don't delay! Overseas registrations often need more time for processing. Remember, your ballot must be sent to you in time for you to complete and return it. Build in some buffer time.

4. How do I confirm that I am still registered to vote?

Go to the OVF ELECTION OFFICIAL DIRECTORY lookup service. Call or email your local election office back in your hometown to request a confirmation. * Click here

Tea - 4 - 2 - Vote

Women's Equality Day on 26 August commemorates the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution which gave American women full voting rights in 1920. Marina Mecl tells the story.

.

Collective memory pinpoints the history of women's suffrage to Quaker teacher Susan B. Anthony who in 1837 was the first to stand up for equal pay for women teachers.

Discouraged that the post-Civil War campaign for voting rights for Black-Americans did not extend to women, Anthony founded the American Equal Rights Association in 1866 and the National Woman Suffrage Association in 1868. She is the first woman ever to be depicted on U.S. currency – the new dollar coin in 1979.



It all started at a tea party: Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Lucretia Mott met for tea in Seneca Falls, New York, eight years after having met at the first World Anti-Slavery Convention in London in 1840, where they were neither allowed to sit with their husbands in the main hall nor speak at the convention. That afternoon they laid out the plans for the first Woman's Rights Convention to be held on July 19 and 20, 1848, at the Wesleyan Chapel in Seneca Falls.
